

## Direct Debit:

Only available to members with a bank account in the United Kingdom. Those wishing to start paying their subscription by Direct Debit, can pay in one lump sum or by instalments. Instalments will now be divided by 12 equal payments. The first three months instalments will be collected in a lump sum on the 5th June. The remainder (nine instalments) will be collected monthly thereafter.
